- Today, I won't be miniViewing any programs, instead I thought I'd give you a tour of my menu bar.
- That, in itself, can be considered a miniViews, because as some of you may know, my menu bar is quite full
- Left to right, on the right side of my menu bar
 - Sticky Windows
 - Made by: Donelleschi
 - Gives you a black butterfly icon in your menu bar
 - Makes your windows "sticky" by allowing them to be placed on any side of your desktop (except the top)
 - If you don't want your dock to get in the way of your "sticky windows", it allows you to not make one side of your desktop sticky
 - Say you're performing a task that requires a lot of window movement, and you don't want your windows to become sticky. All you do is go to the Sticky Windows icon, and select "Disable Sticky Windows."
 - This will make the application temporarily inactive, while keeping it open. To reactivate it, simply click on "Enable Sticky Windows."
 - iKey
 - Made by: Script Software
 - Allows you to make keyboard shortcuts for just about anything
 - You can create your own customized actions, spurred by different launchers such as
 - A keyboard event
 - Date/Time event
 - Application event
 - System event
 - Context event
 - You can make just about any action using iKey
 - There's even more you can do with iKey, and to go through all its features would require it to have its own miniView
 - Break

What's in my Menu Bar?

- Usually, these temporary URLs are relegated to my desktop, which is where I normally keep my temporary files
- Now, I don't need to worry about that because of URLwell
 - This menu bar app allows you to drag URLs directly from Safari (or probably any other web browser) onto the "@" sign menu bar icon
 - Or you can enter these URLs yourself by clicking on "Add Item" within the URLwell submenu
- When you've viewed a URL, you can choose in the prefs to either have the item checked off, or cleared from the menu
 - Unfortunately, you can't uncheck URLs, so you can't make them "unread" again
 - If you want to revisit a checked site, you still can, but it will stay checked off
- You can export your items as either plain text or html
 - Plain text gives you the URLs of the sites in URLwell, and HTML gives you the titles of the websites in an HTML file, linking you to the different sites you have listed
- DockSwitch
 - Made by: Loopware
